- 1. Students may declare the Fashion Design major after completing 12 hours of Kent State non-developmental courses with a cumulative 2.75 GPA. Kent Core courses required by the Fashion Design major include: ARTH 22006 Ancient and Medieval Art, ARTH 22007 Renaissance to Modern Art, ECON 22060 Principles of Microeconomics and MATH 11009 Modeling Algebra, MATH 11010 Algebra for Calculus, MATH 11012 Intuitive Calculus or MATH 10772 Modeling Algebra Plus.
- 4. Only students admitted directly into Fashion Design are permitted to complete FDM 10010 Fashion Fundamentals in the fall semester.
- 5. All Fashion Design majors are required to participate in a study away or study abroad experience to fulfill a degree requirement (usually completed during junior year).
