GRADUATE SCHOOL Q&A

Q: When should I attend graduate school?

A: Graduate school is for students of all ages and life stages. What is most important is that you choose to attend when you are <u>READY</u>. Whether it is right after undergrad or after a few years of working in your career, there's no right or wrong time.

Q: How much does graduate school cost?

A: Graduate school does cost more per credit than undergraduate credits. On average, many state Institutions charge \$300+ per credit for graduate courses, while private institutions charge \$500+ per credit.

Q: What is the typical workload for graduate school?

A: Workload usually includes lots of reading and assignments, papers, presentations, and extensive final examinations.

Q: What are the typical requirements to graduate from grad school?

A: For a master's degree, typically core coursework, a certain number of credits, practical experience, and thesis or written/oral examination are required for completion.

For a doctoral degree, typically core coursework, a certain number of credits, and a dissertation/dissertation defense or capstone coursework are required for completion.
