

The song is in the style known as "SON" which is the folk song tradition of Eastern Cuba and the basis for what we call "SALSA" today. But specifically, it is a "PREGÓN" which is a song a vendor sings to sell his wares, in this case peanuts!

The setting is a clearing in the Appalachian Mountains during the early 1900's. Mountain life in the early days of our country was one of privation and hard work, but people were happy and a visit from a travelling salesman was an exciting event. The intensity of their temperaments occasionally brought them to violence and tragedy.

(Original notes by Constance Hardinge, 1962).

Mountain Ballad was choreographed by Constance Hardinge for Bristol Ballet in 1962 and later set on Atlanta Ballet in 1963. It was included in the Bicentennial Dance Festival sponsored by the Tennessee Arts Commission in Knoxville in 1976 and has been in the repertoire of several other companies since then. Professor Rockland danced the role of Mountain Boy with Bristol Ballet and Roanoke Ballet and previously staged this work for Colorado Dance Theatre and Mahoning Valley Ballet.

With an upbringing in England and professional dance experience in New York City, at the age of 28, Constance Hardinge turned her focus toward teaching and started the Bristol Ballet School in 1948. Later she developed the Bristol Ballet Company and the Dance program at Virginia Intermont College. Affectionately known as Hardye by her students, she brought Bristol Ballet to the status of an Honors Company within the Southeast Region of the National Association of Regional Ballet. Graduates who studied under Hardinge have danced, choreographed and directed schools, companies and university programs around the United States and abroad. These performances of Mountain Ballad are dedicated with love to Constance Hardinge (1920-1992).


