About the Artists

Anna Grudskaya is a classically-trained pianist and pedagogue. Winner of the Concerto/Aria Competition at Santa Clara University, the Van Waynen Piano Competition, and Hartt Chamber Music Competition, Dr. Grudskaya has performed in concert halls in the United States and abroad. Festival appearances have included the Classical Music Festival in Eisenstadt, Austria; International Keyboard Institute and Festival in New York City; Aspen Music Festival; and Beijing International Music Festival and Academy. As a performer, she enjoys both solo and collaborative performances. Recent performances have included a recording of En Contretemps by Istvan Hornyak for the Kent State University Dance Program. She also appears often as a solo and chamber musician for M.U.S.i.C. - Stars in the Classics concerts in and around Cleveland. Grudskaya currently serves as piano faculty at Kent State University, The Hartt Community Division, The Music Settlement, and summer faculty at Interlochen Center for the Arts. She has previously taught as piano faculty at New York University, The Hartt School, and has instructed piano lessons through her private piano studio since 2007. She is a member of the Steinway & Sons Educational Partnership. Grudskaya has earned degrees from The Hartt School (Doctor of Musical Arts with a minor in Music History), New York University (Advanced Certificate), Mannes College of Music (Master of Music), and Santa Clara University (Bachelor of Music and Bachelor of Science). Her primary teachers have included Hans Boepple, Pavlina Dokovska, Vladimir Valjarevic, Eteri Andjaparidze, and David Westfall. She has also worked with distinguished artists, such as Menahem Pressler, Nelita True, Boris Berman, Ann Schein, Alan Chow, and Alessio Bax.

Violinist Erin Phelps Reidhead received her bachelor's degree in violin performance with Academic Honors from the Cleveland Institute of Music (CIM), where she studied with Stephen Rose, principal second violin of the Cleveland Orchestra. During her time at CIM, Erin took long-term Suzuki teacher training with Kimberly Meier-Sims and is registered to teach all 10 books. She was also a two-time recipient of the Alumni Association Award for Academic Achievement. Erin was on faculty at the Sato Center for Suzuki Studies at CIM from 2012-2022, and is now focusing on her home studio in Pepper Pike, Ohio .Along with several colleagues, Erin is a founding member of the Cleveland Center for Suzuki Studies (CCSS), which began in Fall 2022. The CCSS is a collective of like-minded teachers that provides an enriching environment for Suzuki group classes and outreach performances in a warm and supportive community. An avid orchestral and chamber musician, Erin is a member of the Canton Symphony Orchestra, the Firelands Symphony Orchestra, CityMusic Cleveland, and the Cleveland Pops Orchestra. She is a frequent performer throughout Northeast Ohio, having played at Playhouse Square, the Blossom Music Center, Severance Hall, the Maltz Center, and with the Akron Symphony, BlueWater Chamber Orchestra, Erie Philharmonic, the Candlelight Concerts series, and Earth and Air String Orchestra. She has performed with artists such as Johnny Mathis, The Who, Harry Connick Jr., and the Beach Boys. Erin collaborated with harpist Yolanda Kondonassis as part of the BlueWater Chamber Orchestra or a recording of a new harp concerto by Takuma Itoh, which is slated for release in 2026. She has participated in the National Repertory Orchestra, Beijing International Music Festival and Academy, Bowdoin International Music Festival, Banff Masterclass Residency, and ENCORE School for Strings. Originally from Frederick, Maryland, Erin grew up as a Suzuki student, study-ing with Ronda Cole and Lisa-Beth Lambert. She currently resides in Pepper Pike with her husband, horn player Ben Reidhead, and their four children – a violinist, two bassists, and a cellist.
