Archival Studies Concentration — Required and Recommended Courses

The MLIS requires 37 credits total, including 13 credits of core. To pursue the concentration in Archival Studies, students must also complete 12 credit hours of archival studies courses, as well as 12 general electives credits, to reach the 37 credit hour degree requirement (13+12+12 = 37).

If an MLIS student takes the 12 required concentration credit hours and 6 additional credits from courses recommended here, their program will meet the Society of American Archivists recommendations for completion of at least 18 credits of archives-related coursework for graduate programs in archival studies.¹
