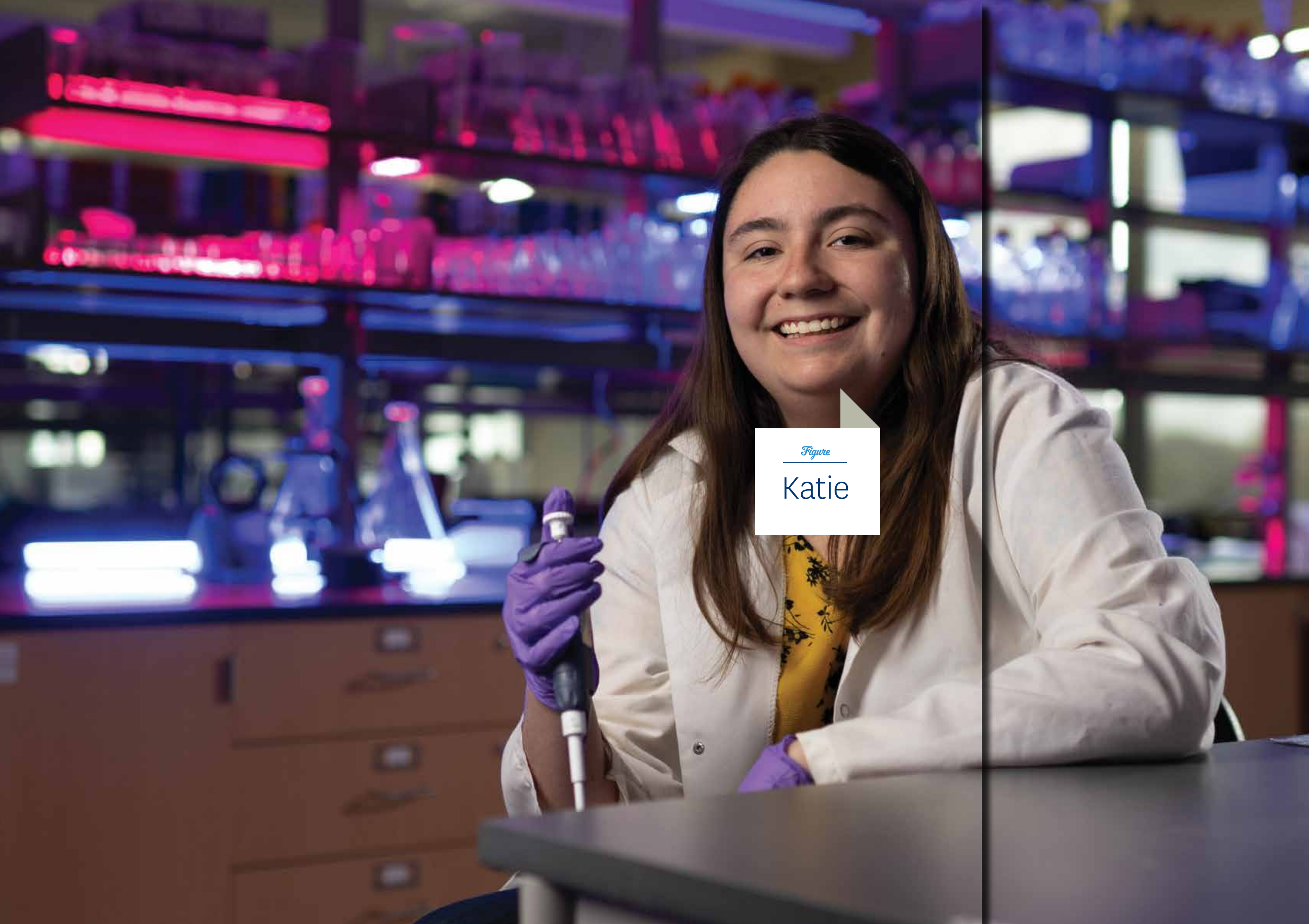

Research was important to her when she was choosing a university. She found that other universities she looked at didn't allow students to participate in research until their junior or senior year. That — and when she saw that Kent State had plenty of high-tech microscopes — became the biggest deciding factors in her choosing Kent State.

“Employers and grad schools look at grades and boards, of course, but they really want research experience, too. The fact that Kent State got me into a lab so soon in order to learn lab skills and gain research experience has made all the difference and will help me stand out.”

How Kent State makes it work

Kent State's high level of research activity earned the university the prestigious, national R1 designation. Only the top 4% of U.S. universities hold this elite status. Having active research on campus creates opportunities for students to participate in meaningful investigation and gain invaluable hands-on experience, knowledge and skills for any career path.

The best thing Kent State could have done for my career was to allow me to get into research my first semester, freshman year. It has given me the best possible experience and will give me four years of research experience as an undergrad.


He studied with students from Kent State and from all over the world. His daily routine was completely immersed in local culture. The things he saw and the people he met expanded his view of the world.

Study abroad experiences add additional depth to a student's resume, with qualities that employers look for, like increased confidence, an expanded worldview and being comfortable working with people from other cultures.

Choose your destination

You can study abroad at Kent State's campus in Florence or at one of our locations that partner with a local university in **Paris, London, Prague, Geneva or Hong Kong**, or in **Curtiba, Brazil; Yongin, South Korea; or Kigali, Rwanda**. In all, there are more than 200 **study abroad opportunities** for Kent State students in 60 countries worldwide.

There are also study away opportunities for the **School of Fashion in Los Angeles** and at **Kent State's New York City Fashion** location.

Travel with purpose

Studying abroad isn't a vacation, it's an intense, immersive learning experience. Course-work can be accelerated and condensed to fit a semester's worth of classes into a few weeks. Because you're a student, not a tourist, you learn more about daily living and what it's like to live and study in another country.

Financial aid for studying abroad

Kent State knows study abroad experiences are valuable, so we work to help students find financial aid and scholarships. Students are eligible, in most cases, to receive financial aid for studying abroad. Information from your annual FAFSA form helps determine your eligibility and awards.

An international university

Kent State's education abroad program and the university's programs for international students were recognized for excellence in internationalization with a Senator Paul Simon Award for Comprehensive Internationalization. Kent State was the only U.S. university to earn the 2022 award.

Students and professors from more than 100 countries have found Kent State to be a welcoming place with special resources to assist international visitors.

The Flash Activity Board (FAB) plans many events for students each year.



Overall wellness and safety

The overall health, well-being and safety of our students is very important to us. For fitness, the Warren Student Recreation and Wellness Center offers state-of-the-art fitness equipment and a full schedule of activities. An on-campus health center offers full service primary care. If a student is feeling stressed, anxious or depressed they can access on-campus mental health and counseling resources.

For safety, Kent State has a dedicated, fully accredited campus police department and student escorts.

Find your community

You can find a match for most social, academic or professional interests through Kent State's 350+ student organizations. There's something for everyone and it's one of the best ways to make friends, get involved in philanthropy and gain experience for your career.

It’s not very far

Cleveland, Akron, Youngstown and Canton are just a short drive away from Kent. These cities offer airports, professional sports, concerts, museums, theatres and a renowned orchestra.

Getting around is easy

Kent State is exceptionally walkable. It’s easy to get anywhere on campus from anywhere else on campus. The footprint of the Kent Campus is just one square mile — and it’s just a mile from the center of campus to the center of downtown Kent. Portage Area Regional Transit Authority (PARTA) provides bus service on campus, around Kent and to surrounding communities, including Cleveland and Akron. Spin provides shared electric bikes and scooters that are available on campus and within the city of Kent for use by students, professors, staff and the community.

Going to one of Kent State’s regional campuses offered me a lot of flexibility and gave me a college option that was close to home. It gave me an experience that I felt suited me better, personally, while I worked on my degree. It’s a great option, I think, for non-traditional students who might also be busy with families or full-time jobs.

How Kent State makes it work

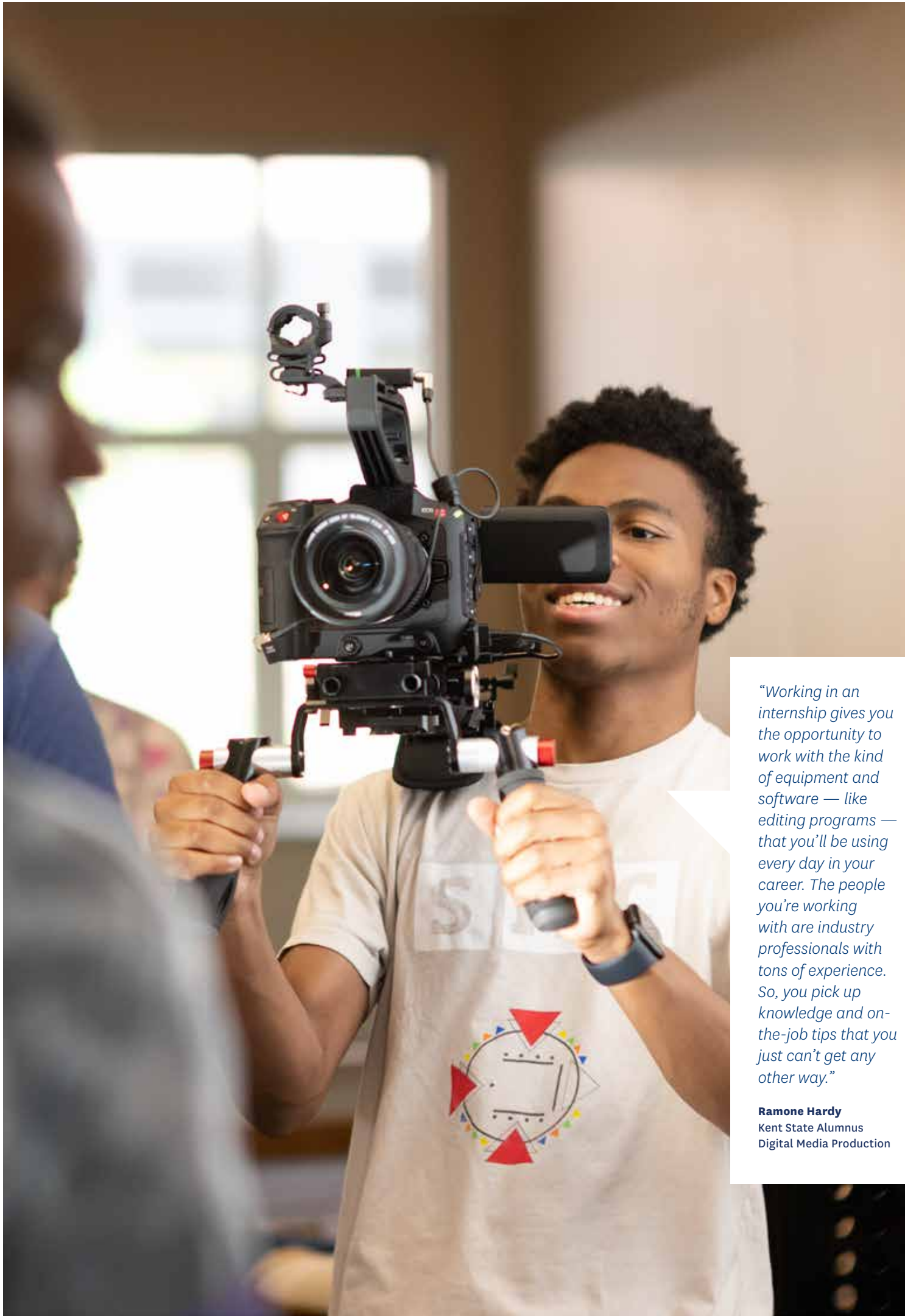

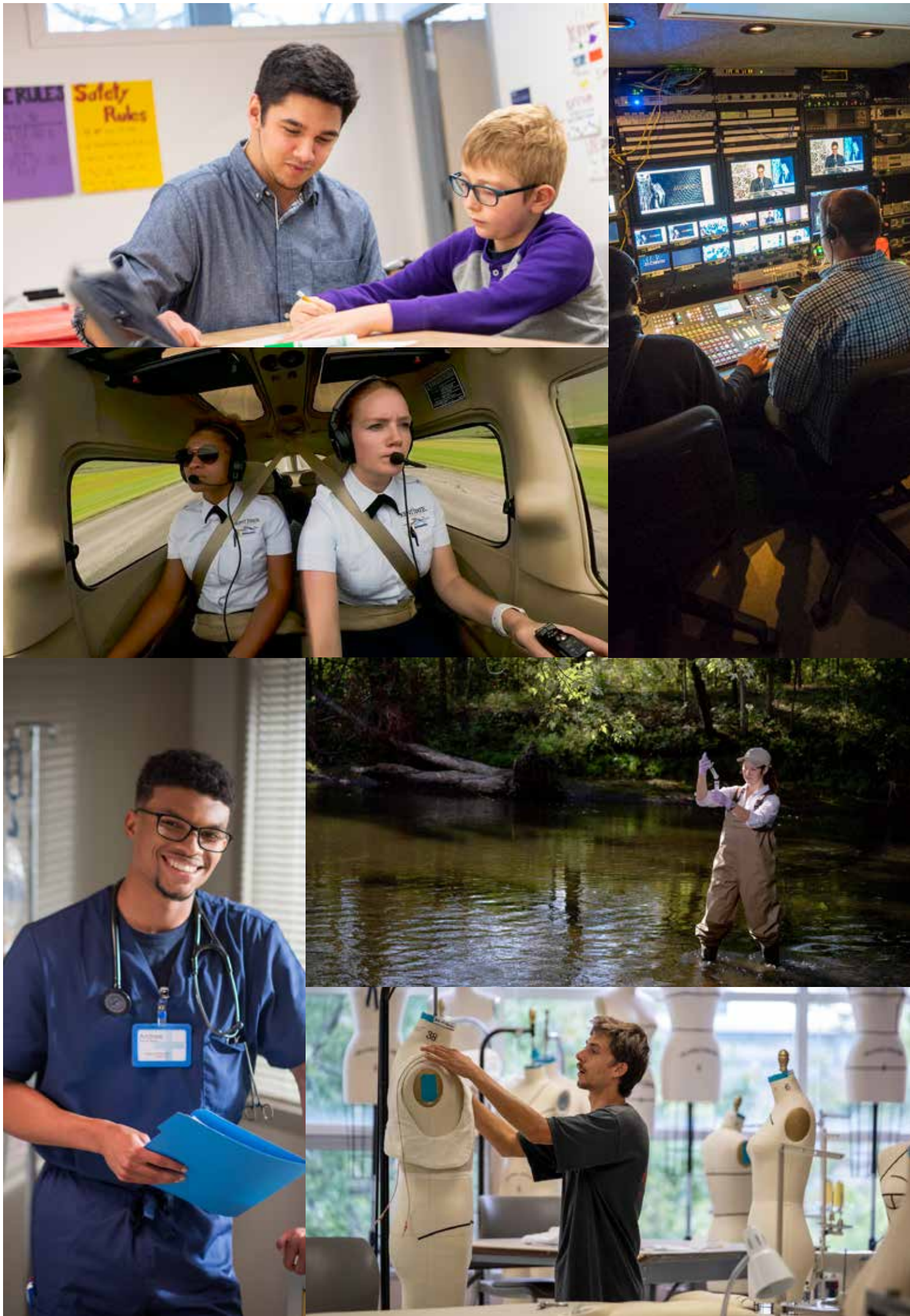

1. SCIENCE CORRIDOR

This area of campus has a concentration of STEM-focused departments and colleges, including aeronautics and engineering, nursing, biological sciences and mathematics. It's also home to the Brain Health Research Institute (BHRI), the Integrated Sciences Building (ISB), the Advanced Materials and Liquid Crystal Institute (AMLCI).

2. RISMAN PLAZA

It's the central hub of Kent State, the library (the tallest building in Portage County), the Kent Student Center, The Hub Dining Area and the Student Green. There's always something interesting happening around Risman Plaza.

3. THE MAC CENTER

The Memorial Athletic and Convocation (MAC) Center is where you can catch all the MACtion of MidAmerica Conference men's and women's basketball, volleyball, wrestling and gymnastics.

4. MANCHESTER FIELD/CENTENNIAL GREEN

This green space in the center of campus is about the size of three football fields and is used for both scheduled and pop-up events throughout the year.

5. DESIGN INNOVATION (DI) HUB

This space contains classrooms, maker-spaces and a dining hall. Labs are open to all makers and contain state-of-the-art tools like 3D and large format printers, laser-cutting and more. There's also a teaching kitchen and a Blank Lab for creating immersive, multimedia experiences.

6. FRONT CAMPUS

You'll find the original campus buildings from the early days of Kent State in this peaceful, relaxing landscape that's full of tall trees and sculptures. You'll also find campus landmarks like The Rock, The KSU Archway connecting the Esplanade to downtown Kent, a gazebo and the Wick Poetry Center. It's also home to lots of black squirrels – our unofficial mascot.

7. MAY 4 MEMORIAL AND MAY 4 VISITORS CENTER

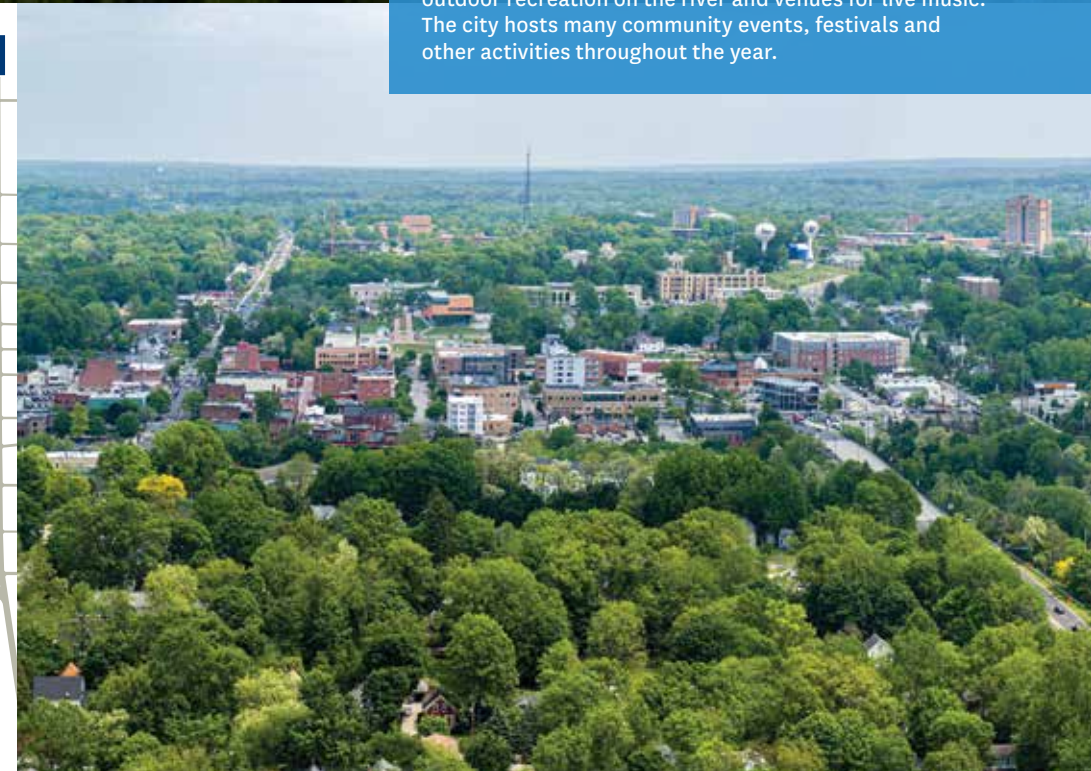

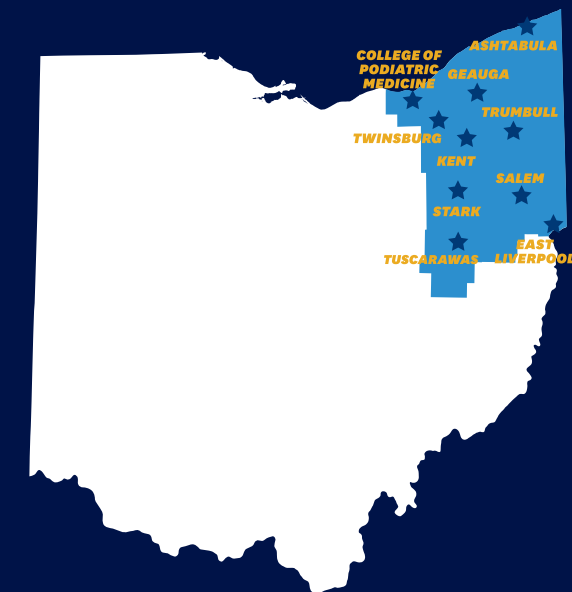

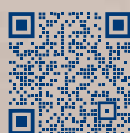
