



Behavioral Intervention Specialist Certificate Program Plan of Study

The Behavior Intervention Specialist Certificate Program (BISCP) is a 24-hour graduate certificate offered through the Special Education program and awarded by Kent State University (KSU). The BISCP is recognized as an Ohio Department of Education online graduate certificate program. In addition, it is planned that the coursework comprising the BISCP will be approved by the Behavior Analyst Certification Board (BACB) as meeting the course work component of the requirements to be eligible to sit for the Board Certified Behavior Analyst (BCBA) Examination under the 5th Edition Task List. If you plan to pursue certification as a BCBA you will need to complete the following: 1. Master’s or doctoral degree, 2. Planned BACB-approved* course work sequence contained in the BISCP, and 3. BACB-approved 2000-hour supervised practicum (see www.bacb.com for details on each of these requirements). After completing each of these requirements, you are eligible to submit your materials to the BACB for approval to sit for the BCBA Examination. **Please note that the determination of the suitability of your materials to sit for the BCBA Examination is made solely by the BACB.**

The courses prescribed on this page are required to earn the BISCP certificate from KSU. Any master’s or doctoral degree program must be created and approved by your advisor or advisory committee – a separate process from completing the BISCP course work sequence.
