Requirements to graduate with the BS degree program: To graduate, students must have minimum 120 credit hours, 39 upper-division credit hours of coursework, a minimum 2.250 major GPA and minimum 2.000 cumulative GPA. They must also fulfill an approved experiential learning experience, a two-course diversity requirement (domestic and global), complete a writing intensive course with a minimum C (2.000) grade. 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It is recommended that students intending to pursue the B.S. in Hospitality and Event Management through Kent State University consult with academic advisors at both Cuyahoga Community College and Kent State University.
