What is your role in implementing the ELR?

- Examine ELR course proposal from perspective of strategic vertical and horizontal placement within program curricula
- Examine competing or duplicative options
- Review for meeting strategic college/departamental goals
- Explore linkages with faculty teaching and research scholarship
- Review for assessment and outcome measures as well as for rigors of the assessment
- Provide signature of approval/disapproval and forward response to chair/assistant dean/director

What are the expected number of contact hours?

The number of contact hours required may vary based upon the activity, supervising faculty member, and learning objectives.



Can ELR requirements be completed as a part of a student's associate's degree program if they are continuing on for a bachelor's degree?

Yes, however, a program may require additional ELRs to be completed!

How can I find a community partner?

- A short list of available community partnering community agencies can be obtained from OEECE website. Contact the OEECE for a complete listings.
- The OEECE can assist in identifying other potential sites based on your disciplinary interests and geographical location.

How will the ELR credit be applied to a student's record?

- All courses designated as an ELR will have an attribute per the registrar
- Section courses will have the ELR attribute added upon approval. Once the ELR subcommittee approves the ELR, the information goes to the Registrar and the attribute will be added
- Plus-1 Credit course is a designated ELR. Upon completion, the student will receive a final grade from the faculty of the primary course

How far in advance should applications be submitted by:

Faculty members

- Before the course is scheduled by the scheduler

Students

- Plus-1 Credit applications are due by the 4th week of classes each semester
- Non-course application are due at least one week prior to the experience
- Due dates may vary by supervising faculty members
