The following courses can also be taken at EGCC:

- Non-Business/Non-Applied Business Elective – any college level course not already completed and not from the following subjects: *Accounting, Accounting Technology, Business, Business Management and Related Technologies, Economics, Entrepreneurship, Finance, Information Technology, Management and Information Systems, Marketing, or Managerial Marketing.*
- Up to 70 credits may be transferred into the Bachelor of Science in Insurance Studies degree from EGCC.

Requirements to graduate with the Bachelor of Science in Insurance Studies degree program: To graduate, students must have minimum 120 credit hours, 39 upper-division credit hours of coursework, a minimum 2.000 major GPA and minimum 2.000 cumulative GPA. They must also fulfill an approved experiential learning experience, a two-course diversity requirement (domestic and global), complete a writing intensive course with a minimum C (2.000) grade.
