The following courses can also be taken at EGCC:

- NET 106 Introduction to IT Security will transfer to Kent State as IT 13000 Applied Security Essentials.
- General electives – any college level course not already completed.
- Up to 73-75 credits may be transferred into the Bachelor of Science in Information Technology degree from EGCC.

Requirements to graduate with the Bachelor of Science in Information Technology degree program: To graduate, students must have minimum 120 credits hours, 39 upper-division credits hours of coursework, a minimum 2.0 major GPA and minimum 2.00 cumulative GPA. They must also fulfill an approved experiential learning experience, a two-course diversity requirement (domestic and global), complete a writing intensive course with a minimum C (2.000) grade. 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It is recommended that students intending to pursue the Bachelor of Science in Information Technology through Kent State University consult with academic advisors at both Eastern Gateway Community College and Kent State University.

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
