This course will introduce students to the rich archaeology of Ireland. This will include the famous Neolithic period, including famous **Neolithic passage tombs** like Newgrange and Knowth, **Bronze Age sites**, Celtic, Viking, and later historic periods. Students will explore field sites as well as several indoor and outdoor **museums**. Ireland also has a strong tradition of **experimental archaeology** at places like University College Dublin. Students will thus be introduced to how **Irish Archaeologists pursue** this important sub-discipline with a visit to the college and experimental demonstrations such as **ancient bronze casting, stone working, and house construction**.
