Contest Rules

Format and Presentation

Between 8.5 X 11 and 11 X 17 inches

Artwork must not be framed or outlined with borders

Artwork should clearly represent the theme of the contest

Medium

Permitted in group I-III: acrylic, oil paint, watercolor, indelible market pens, felt-tip pens, soft ball point pens, ink, Crayola or any similar medium, pencil or charcoal.

Permitted in group IV: All mediums (in addition to all the above, computer generated artwork, collage work, photography, etc.)

Submission

A digital image of the work must be emailed to airport@kent.edu prior to August 1st, 2020 with the following information:

First and last name

Mailing address

Name and address of child school

Group Category being submitted to

Finalists will be contacted and requested to provide original artwork.

Winners will be placed on display at the airport during the Centennial Celebration. Winner announcement will be based on the number of submissions but no later than September 1st 2020.

Reproduction Rights

Once received, entries become the property of Kent State University and may be used for a variety of purposes to include publishing on university websites and marketing. At the end of the competition, original art will be returned to contestants.
