Of these 5 priority areas what do they mean to you?

- Add prevention strategies into our strategic plan and the SOC implementation grant
 - Impact high, likelihood high
- Brain research applied to prevention
 - Impact high, likelihood high
 - Stark county likes to be cutting edge and on the forefront
 - Families that we work with are very in tune to being a part of something new and trying new things
- Create crossover funding opportunities
 - Impact high, accessibility low/medium
 - Stark is a very collaborative county
- Have strategic conversations about root causes
 - Impact high, accessibility low
 - A very hard thing to do, impactful but hard
 - Time consuming
 - Finding out the root cause is doable but lengthy, harder to do than root solution
 - You can do it in your own community and its possible but it's hard
 - Everyone comes at it from a different angle and
 - One of primary places a parent looks is education system
 - Hard time communicating with educators about what is happening and next steps
 - Might argue changing it to root solutions instead of root causes
 - Resiliency will help with the issues, root solutions is more empowering

- Devil's advocate: looking at root cause, need to look at root cause in order to understand
 - Fix what you can quickly
 - We should be solution based
 - What if we utilized skilled wraparound facilitation
 - Identify what you need
 - What do we need to create
 - Can do more at community level with root solutions
 - Is it root need?
 - Strategic wraparound facility that's targeted
- Need data to help figure out what the challenges are
 - Might only be providing services we have because it's funded
- Family Testimony
 - Didn't know where to start looking
 - Went to primary care physician and he didn't know where to send them
 - Serious lack of communication with providers
 - Do we need a communication plan for prevention?
 - Use what's available and create prevention education piece
- Strategic with the goal of educating
- Certain diagnoses in mental illness that are not preventable but doesn't mean kids can't be resilient
- Solutions should be added to the phrase
- Family council committees
 - Accessibility(availability) medium, impact high
 - Stark county does good job of working together
 - Community process standpoint it's our go to mechanism
 - Where are we viewing this from

Each root cause is going to require specific and unique strategies

- We have to make sure we are being specific to certain regions of the county
