


Washington Program in National Issues (WPNI)-

The Political Science degree at Kent State University is designed to empower students and prepare them for success. With four areas of concentration, students may choose the area best suited to their interests and career goals.

- The American Politics concentration provides students with specialized study of U.S. institutions, including Congress, the Presidency, and the Courts, as well as courses on state and local politics, political opinion, election politics, and the media.
- The Transnational/Comparative concentration focuses on international policy and politics, including aid and development, energy and oil, human rights, Middle East politics, and Latin American politics.
- The Policy concentration offers courses focused on the policy-making processes that define governance. Here, students can take courses in health care policy, environmental policy, regulatory policy, and foreign policy.
- The General Major allows students to select any Political Science courses for their major, rather than selecting an area of concentration.

Students may also choose to minor in Political Science. Whether majoring or minoring in this field of study, students are prepared for a range of career opportunities upon graduation.
